### Livewell gives out grants to grow your own food

GRANTS are up for grabs in a bid to get more people growing their own healthy food.

Maldon District Council is now providing funding to individuals, groups and organisations who want to promote growing healthy food.

Grants are available for schemes designed to get



people growing fruit and vegetables for the first time, helping to promote the benefits of growing their own produce or which educate people about healthy eating.

Applications can be made for up to £1,000 which can be spent on buying resources, renting allotments or training to provide education and skills.

The council says one of the aims of the Ready, Steady, Grow scheme is to give all residents the opportunity to grow and enjoy their own food.

The council has identified obesity, mental health, social isolation and the ageing population as the four key areas its wishes to see influenced as a result of the scheme.



#### Jam factory Wilkin & Sons donate 52,000 jars to polio appeal

A POLIO-FIGHTING initiative has been recognised for its efforts in raising hundreds of thousands of pounds.

World famous jam-makers Wilkin & Sons and Nigel Dyson have been part of the Rotary Purple4Polio initiative to rid the world of the infectious disease.



Rotary clubs have been raising funds to eradicate the disease for around 40 years and according Rotary Club of Kelvedon and District president Mr Dyson the fight is now on the "home run".

Mr Dyson and Tiptree-based Wilkin & Sons are one of ten winners of a new People of Action Polio Award in Rotary Great Britain and Ireland.

The jam producers made 52,000 pots of their greengage and plum jam which were then distributed around the country to Rotarians.

Once the jars were empty, they were filled with coins and this, along with proceeds from selling the jam, raised more than £131,000.

With double match funding from the Gates Foundation, it has raised nearly £400,000. Mr Dyson is keen to continue raising the last of the funds needed to ensure polio is wiped out for good.



## Gourmet Hand Made Raw Dog Meals















#### If you FIND a dog...

- Look around the area and see if there is anyone obviously looking for their lost pet.
- Report to the local council (dog warden); it is the law and they may already have had the
  dog reported as missing. You can find details of your local dog warden on-line here:
   www.gov.uk/report-stray-dog
- If you can, take the dog to a local vets for them to scan for a chip.
   In most cases they will then be able to call the owner if dog is chipped, or call the local dog warden to collect if not.
- In Scotland you should also report to the police.
- Also check in the 'Lost' section of the DogLost website to see if this dog has been reported as missing. www.doglost.co.uk/dog-search.php?status=Lost
- Many of our volunteers in the area do have scanners so may be able to come out and scan
  the dog for you. You can ask on local DogLost pages if anyone can help or call our head
  office for more information.
- Register the dog on the DogLost website: <u>www.doglost.co.uk</u>
   and share on Social Media such as Facebook / Twitter, local DogLost pages and groups.
- You can also print posters from this dog's page using the View Poster button and put up around the area that he / she was found. Don't forget to laminate in case it rains.
- If you can, put Posters in local shops, pubs, garages, supermarkets; everywhere that there are a lot of people. Spread the word to try to find the owners . . .
