Maldon Cycling Club are hosting Led Rides, which welcome cyclists all ages and abilities to join in an evening circuit around Maldon District.

The club generally meets at the Saints Football Club Hut in Promenade Park. A spokesman said: "Cycling is already one of the fastest growing sports in the UK and with our encouragement we want to help people understand the thrill of getting back in the saddle."

"These are rides led by British Cycling and CTC trained ride leaders, who will guide participants along the route, and provide tips and advice on cycle safety and skills." "Rides vary from beginners to more experienced cyclists, so you can pick a level to suit your skills and enjoyment."

"Whatever level you choose, you'll be riding on safe routes, with your ride leaders. If you haven't dusted off your bike for a while, they'll happily check it over for you. An introductory led ride is about as much fun as you can have on two wheels." Rides will last up to 1.5 hours and cover ten to 12 miles.

Fred's owner Jeremy Goldsmith said: "These newly born ducklings were only born recently. They were part of a large group, but it was too many for the mother so she left them behind." Mr Goldsmith added: "Fred is a lovely natured dog and is so good with them. When he comes in at night the ducklings come with him. They all sleep together in the hallway."

It Starts with Education

Support for Yomelelani from local residents has been wonderful over the past year and this is much appreciated by both the staff and the trustees.

Yomelelani is a community pre-school project located in Zwelihle, a township on the outskirts of Hermanus, near Cape Town. Aged 5 or less, the majority of the school's children are orphans or from one parent families. Classified as an ECDC (Early Childhood Development Centre) some remarkable events have been experienced over the last few years and your support has made this possible.

A local fishery company (Aqunion) in 2015 offered to rebuild the dilapidated buildings allowing the school to more than double in size from 60 to 155 children. It is now the largest ECDC in Zwelihle which has a population of around 50,000. The Government Grant only covers 30% of the school's nutrition and wage costs, fees another 19%. With total costs this year estimated at around £70,000, that leaves a £35,000 shortfall to be covered by donations.

The Yomelelani Trust, which we set up 3 years ago as a UK registered charity (Reg.No.1161202), was an attempt to raise funds to cover the shortfall. Donations have appeared from many places such as **St Bartholomews Church in Wickham Bishops, All Saints Church Orpington, and Purley Rotary Club**. Fund raising events have included a summer vegetable stall at Chudleigh Village church in Devon, a **bridge day in Wickham Bishops, and a musical evening at Coggeshall church**. Additionally several generous individual donations have been received. Thanks to you all, we have managed annually to bridge the gap so far.

Is it all worthwhile? The Chairman of the Yomelelani Management Committee is also the Head of the local Primary school to which nearly all of our children progress. What is exciting is that all of the Yomelelani children move to the top of their respective classes and we now hear that one of the first pupils to leave the Primary school has won a bursary to a mixed Secondary school. An amazing achievement for an orphan child from a very deprived background. More will soon follow.

More than two decades have passed since the end of Apartheid but now, through education, we are starting to realise how the 'seismic' shift required to bring about a more equal society can be realised.

Yomelelani children are the founder members of that trend.

If you FIND a dog ...

- Look around the area and see if there is anyone obviously looking for their lost pet.
- Report to the local council (dog warden); it is the law and they may already have had the
 dog reported as missing. You can find details of your local dog warden on-line here:
 www.gov.uk/report-stray-dog
- If you can, take the dog to a local vets for them to scan for a chip.
 In most cases they will then be able to call the owner if dog is chipped, or call the local dog warden to collect if not.
- In Scotland you should also report to the police.
- Also check in the 'Lost' section of the DogLost website to see if this dog has been reported as missing. www.doglost.co.uk/dog-search.php?status=Lost
- Many of our volunteers in the area do have scanners so may be able to come out and scan
 the dog for you. You can ask on local DogLost pages if anyone can help or call our head
 office for more information.
- Register the dog on the DogLost website: www.doglost.co.uk
 and share on Social Media such as Facebook / Twitter, local DogLost pages and groups.
- You can also print posters from this dog's page using the View Poster button and put up around the area that he / she was found. Don't forget to laminate in case it rains.
- If you can, put Posters in local shops, pubs, garages, supermarkets; everywhere that there
 are a lot of people. Spread the word to try to find the owners . . .


