- by the end of week 2 NCSN volunteers had delivered leaflets to every household in Great & Little Braxted, Great & Little Totham and Wickham Bishops, reaching out a helping hand to 5,900 people, 1619 of whom are over 65 and 412 over 80 years old
- by the end of week 3 NCSN volunteers had received over 200 calls and texts thanking us for giving peace of mind to vulnerable people in our communities who weren't sure how they would get through the pandemic until they heard from NCSN
- most importantly, as of the end of week 4 there are 123 registered NCSN volunteers who have met the needs of their self-isolating and shielding neighbours 166 times.

As far as our church is concerned it is still closed and will be for some time , all services are postponed. Weddings and baptisms are delayed until later in the year.

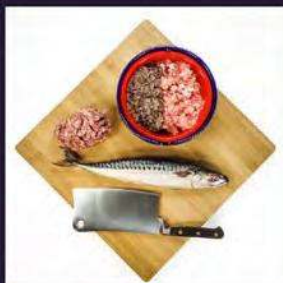

ESSEX WELFARE SERVICES

Essex County Council has established the Essex Welfare Services as part of PROVIDE (a health and social care service). EWS has been set up to assist the most vulnerable in the community to allow them to access shopping, medicine and other support.

Going forwards, GP surgeries will be calling, sending out SMS text messages or posting letters to those who are 70 or older or are offered a flu jab due to pre-existing medical conditions. This is because these people are identified as being vulnerable and having to self-isolate for prolonged periods of time and therefore potentially require additional support.

You may potentially receive a call from the National Shielding Helpline on 0333 3050466 – this is NOT a scam. However, the phoneline is not live and you may receive a message saying they will try again soon.

When they call back, the caller may ask for some details such as your name and NHS number to confirm they are speaking to someone who is deemed as vulnerable, but they will never ask you for details such as you National Insurance Number or bank details.

There are concerns that this service has not been widely publicised and therefore people are leaving reviews on trust sites saying that this is a scam due to the caller asking whether the person is vulnerable or not. It is important that this misinformation is not spread as it could lead to vulnerable individuals missing out on essential support.

Message from District Councillor

During this unprecedented and difficult time for our country, it has been fantastic to see how our community has responded to the situation. Families and neighbours coming together and helping each other. Individuals responding to the need for volunteers for both our community and the NHS.

The volunteers are providing a vital resource, where people are having to self-isolate or are in a category of those that are at risk. It is great to see these groups setup within the different villages and as a member of one of the groups, the appreciation for any support that is being given.

The unfortunate development in this situation is that It has also led to some people exploiting the vulnerable, with scam and phishing emails, if you are unsure about an email, then always check with others before opening it. Never assume they are legitimate

If you are using someone for help, they should be from an organisation that is recognised by the Voluntary service or Essex County Council. They should be able to show an Essex Coronavirus Action identity card.

If you are in need of support, please get in touch and I will provide assistance or help you find the support you need.

No to North Essex Garden Communities

North Essex garden communities in the Budget
: more tax-payers' money wasted.

CAUSE would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone well.

We are still waiting for the Inspector's report about the north Essex garden communities following the hearings in January.

In the meantime, government has made the extraordinary decision to pledge £270 million to RE-ROUTE the A12 close to the villages of Copford, Easthorpe and Messing to squeeze as many houses as possible into West Tey, IF it gets the Inspector's go ahead. This money is in addition to the previously agreed money to upgrade the A12, a project which has been delayed for around three years because of the garden community uncertainty.

However, the A120 dualling between Braintree and the A12 has NOT made it into the next road investment strategy programme and has now been linked with developer contributions from West Tey. Once again, this is evidence of the garden communities project delaying infrastructure.

The Heathrow ruling that the Paris Agreement on climate change had not been taken into account has, we believe, a direct parallel in Local Plans. The authorities did not take the Paris Agreement into account in the garden communities plan.

With this, and with Covid-19, in mind, we wonder how government thinking about spending on pointless projects like moving a trunk road, and on road-building full-stop, will change going forward.

GREAT BRAXTED PARISH COUNCIL 2020 ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY

It is strange writing these notes knowing that there will not be a meeting for people to attend should they want to. The Coronavirus is causing so many cancellations, changes to routines, etc., etc.

The main purpose of this Report is to provide a brief summary of the activities of the Parish Council over the last twelve months. We are a relatively small village (only 286 persons on the latest Electoral Roll) and a Parish Council of only five elected members, plus the Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer. We normally meet only six times a year, but can and do hold extraordinary meetings usually for urgent matters such as planning applications where time is of the essence. This has happened during this year.

I would like to say how grateful I am for the support of my fellow Parish Councillors, so a big THANK YOU to: Iain Armstrong; Richard Collins; Lee Kane and Craig Knapman. Well done gentlemen. We are all volunteers and do not receive any payment.

Also, we are very fortunate to have such an efficient and professional Parish Clerk. Sarah Gaeta has filled in very well and is a great asset to the Parish Council. This year we have also been supported by our District Councillor, Richard Siddall who attends our meetings (when we have them!). He is on Maldon District Council and also on Little Totham Parish Council.

We now have full access to electronic media and all details of Parish Council meetings, activities, news, etc., are on our website. There is the Braxted Residents Facebook page, the monthly Braxted Bulletin and even the good old noticeboard.

As far as the last year is concerned the major event in the village was the bi-annual Braxted Fete which this time included a car boot fair. The day was very successful and with the subsequent Giant Quiz in Braxted Park the Fete Committee raised a record £11,000 +. One third of which was been sent to each church, St Nicholas in Little Braxted and All Saints. The final third is earmarked for community use/projects of Great Braxted. It is currently deposited in the bank account of Great Braxted Parish Council.

On the subject of finance, it should be mentioned that any expenditure has to be agreed by the Council and any two councillors are required to be signatories. The Clerk is responsible for financial matters but is not a signatory to the account. We supported the annual village clean up as we have done for many years. This was in March 2020 and again was successful.

It is normal at the Annual Parish Council Meeting to select a Chairman for the coming year. It had been my intention to stand down as Chairman but to remain a councillor, thus giving one of the other Councillors the opportunity to take over the reins. However, due to the fact that all meetings are suspended at present I will have to stay in office until such time as the pandemic crisis is eased. It is possible that a change in law may allow some meetings to take place using electronics systems such as video conferencing or similar.

I am sure that I may have missed something from this summary, if so my apologies.

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Maldon District Council urge residents to avoid lighting bonfires during lockdown



People who are self isolating rely on fresh air from open windows as they are unable to leave their homes. Officials said people must help them by not creating any pollution that could make their condition worse.

The move has been backed by the British Lung Foundation.

Joseph Carter, head of British Lung Foundation, urged people to be "mindful of others" during the lockdown.

He said: "It's really concerning to see reports of garden waste burning on the rise in recent weeks." People that have a pre-existing lung condition are particularly vulnerable at the moment.

"It's really important that during this time of social isolation we all take the necessary steps needed to keep both ourselves and others safe.

"I urge everyone to be mindful of the health of others."

"We are appealing to anyone carrying out gardening not to get rid of it by burning bonfires, but alternatively build a compost heap instead and put all those nutrients back into the soil."

READERS LETTER:

As summer season approaches we all like to be outside enjoying a nice evening. However it is important to consider how having an outside fire, or fire pit can affect other residents, for example telling your neighbours what you're planning is the right thing to do. Bonfires can be very irritating to neighbours if the smoke stops them enjoying their gardens, opening windows or hanging out washing etc.

Ask yourself the question – "would I like it if one of my neighbours was having a fire and my house was full of the smoke from it?"

The Environmental Protection Act 1990 Section 79 states - That a statutory nuisance includes 'smoke, fumes or gasses emitted from premises so as to be prejudicial to health or a nuisance'.

To be a nuisance smoke must be substantially interfering with a person's enjoyment of their property. Where smoke is drifting across or into someone's property, if they can't open windows or hang their washing out for example, then it can easily be judged to be causing a nuisance. If necessary a notice can be served requiring that the smoke nuisance is abated.

Failure to comply with such a notice can result in prosecution and a fine on conviction of up to £5000.
