ALL SAINT'S GREAT BRAXTED CHURCH NEWS OCTOBER 2020

It is now the start of Autumn and the end of Summer. Schools are back but the virus is still with us and we must take precautions.

Our Harvest Festival will be on SUNDAY 4th October at 11.15 am. For the last few years we have asked for supplies for the Colchester Soup Run which has supported the homeless and disadvantaged and we are one of a number of churches who do this. But this has been temporarily discontinued.

Therefore, we would ask that donations for the Harvest Festival be non-perishable food items, etc., so we can support the local FOOD BANK.

We are pleased that churches have been able to reopen, albeit with some guidelines. We provide hand sanitization and social distancing. Face coverings need to be worn by everyone over the age of 11 unless they have a medical exemption. We also take note of names and contact details for test and trace but do not keep this information or use it for anything else. Such details will be disposed of after 21 days. Also, at present there is no singing of hymns but we can have music by the organ or recorded on CD or IPod.

Early warning: On Sunday 1st November it is All Saints' Day which we will note with a Family Service at 11.15 am. The Remembrance Service will be on Sunday 8th November at 10.50 am so we can have the 2 minute silence at 11am. It is likely that the service at the War Memorial usually on that afternoon will not take place.

October News from Maldon District Councillor

If you are keen to give your views about Maldon District Council and its services, the council is very keen to hear from you. The annual Residents and Business Survey was launched in September and is available for six weeks until 1 November 2020. You can complete it by going to www.maldon.gov.uk/yourviews The questions cover everything from your general views about the District, and then detailed questions about health and wellbeing, climate change and detailed questions about Council services and facilities. Working with the Highways department and Essex County Council, I am continuing to push for the need for changes to be made at the Five Corners junction. As it may take some time for a permanent solution, with the help of resident Colin Heaviside, we have put forward some interim solutions. The proposals are being investigated by the Highway Engineers.

During September, the joint standards committee met to discuss the allegations against the Leader of the council. He was found to have breached the code of conduct in his actions towards myself. Despite what you may have read in the local paper, I brought the complaint not for any political motive, but to ensure that all those that hold a public office behave in an appropriate manner. The decision by the committee, proved that my motives in raising a complaint were justified. The full council will vote this month to agree the sanctions against the former leader.

As I am unable to hold physical district council surgeries at the moment, my intention is to hold these virtually. I am proposing to hold them on October 24th. WEST TEY WATCH Newsletter NEW TOWNS AND INFRASTRUCTURE

WITHOUT admitting the so called 'Garden Communities' were an expensive mistake, Colchester and Braintree Councils have agreed to withdraw West Tey and West of Braintree new towns from the Local Plans. Braintree have started a public consultation, rather than just following the Planning Inspector's guidance. To reduce risks of speculative planning attempts, Local Plans do need to be approved asap. Encouragement to councillors and MPs would be helpful.

North Essex Garden Communities Limited, the company set up by our local authorities and Essex CC, is being wound up. Papers presented to Colchester's Scrutiny Panel on 17 August show NEGC cost us all £6.88million. Colchester have asked for an external review of costs.

Does this mean we can relax, with our region no longer at risk from vast new development, unsupported by appropriate infrastructure? Apparently, not. The Ministry of Housing has started a consultation on planning reform with a new formula for housing targets. Colchester have stated this may result in doubling its house building from around 1,000 to 1,600 pa (60% surely?). In contrast, Braintree thinks it can reduce its numbers.

The suggestion is that land is zoned 'growth'; 'renewal' and 'protected'. Countryside is not given a category, so unless it's specifically designated it may not be protected. The consultation period runs until late October - why not give your views?: https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/planning-for-the-future

On infrastructure, for the A12 widening between Kelvedon and Marks Tey, the 2019 routes through Copford have been eliminated and a preferred route was announced at the end of August: https://highwaysengland.co.uk/our-work/east/a12-chelmsford-to-a120-widening-scheme/

Sadly, the A120 has claimed another young life and there is no obvious progress on rerouting the road. It is in Highways England's pipeline for Road Improvement Strategy 3 - after 2025 - subject to funding being allocated.

Spiders: 8 ways to keep them out of your house this autumn

Spider season is here & they are heading indoors as temperatures outside drop.

Every autumn, spiders head indoors to mate, and avoid the cold weather & although they pose no danger to you (whatever you've read, even the false widow spider presents little threat, and will only bite if provoked) no one really likes them creeping around.

1. Keep things clean

Spiders thrive on the damp & the dark – the nooks & crannies they find in dirty corners & cluttered floors. If you vacuum & dust regularly, store items in boxes that have lids, & generally keep floors & surfaces clear, spiders will be much less inclined to venture inside.

2. Seal your windows and doors

Spiders are small and sneaky, but they still can't get in through solid walls.

Use a DIY sealant to close the little crevices that surround so many doors & windows.

A watertight home keeps out spiders, & has the added bonus of squishing your heating bill.

3. Eat more oranges

Spiders 'taste' with their legs, & if their legs taste something they don't like – in this case, citrus – they'll be out the door as fast as their 8 legs can carry them. 1 strategy is to rub citrus on your door & window frames, although we're not sure what the neighbours would think if they spotted you absent-mindedly massaging your door frame with an orange peel.

4. Get a humane spider catcher

A lot of people take a confrontational approach when dealing with spiders (i.e. splat), but it might be better for the ecosystem & your conscience to redistribute them somewhere other than your home. Spider vacuums will suck up spiders into a long tube to be released at your leisure, without you having to get within striking distance.

5. Let natural light in

Spiders are attracted to the dark & the dank, while spiders' prey (flies, moths etc) are attracted to light bulbs & lamps. Sidestep both by keeping your blinds open, and flooding your home with natural light.

6. Use a vinegar-based deterrent

Spiders hate vinegar just as much as they hate citrus, so vinegar-based cleaning products often send them scurrying back the way they came. The only drawback: you might think it smells awful too.

7. Clean up your exterior

Tidy anything outside your home that spiders might hide in, and use as a bridge to your interior. Think leaves, woodpiles, climbing plants, compost heaps, and even bins.

8. Get a cat

We might think they're cute and cuddly, but in the urban ecosystem, cats are apex predators that kill on sight. Just as good at munching spiders as they are mice, cats are all-purpose pest control, though some are more energetic than others. Rather drastic as a standalone measure, it's probably wise to only get a cat if you also happen to want one.
