Remembrance Sunday

In writing this a month ahead of Remembrance Sunday, I recognise that national and local reactions to COVID19 may yet still change this year's plans. In organising a large Remembrance Day event in a Suffolk town, the over-riding concern has been how to politely ask residents not to attend – and we decided upon saying that we would rather see you attend in 2021 than risk your health in 2020. The same sentiment applies here.

So whilst the Remembrance Sunday service will still go ahead, in a very different form, I would urge you to follow the advice to join in the national commemoration service at the Cenotaph, which will be broadcast on both television and radio.

Should you attend the Remembrance Service at Little Braxted War Memorial, the road closure area has been extended so that no traffic can pass behind the Memorial. We will not ask for volunteers to staff the road closure barriers this year.

Weather permitting I hope to spray-paint the roadways around the memorial with rough rectangles/circles to denote where “bubbles” of up to six may stand safely distanced from another “bubble”. Please remain within your bubble or family group at all times.

There will be no march by the Scouts or Guides, no playing of the Last Post, and no hymns. Just a simple act of remembrance conducted by the Rector commencing at 2.30pm.

There will be a collection bucket at each corner of the triangular green. Before and after the service please respect social distancing and wear a mask.

Doorstep Tribute on Remembrance Day

Doorstep Tribute For The Two Minutes Silence at 11am on Remembrance Day, 11 November.

Maldon District Council is asking residents to mark the two-minutes silence at 11am on 11 November (Remembrance Day) from their doorsteps, to support a national show of pride and appreciation.

Cllr Penny Channer, Vice-Chairman of the Council, said: “The silence on Remembrance Day is one of the most poignant times of the year. It allows us to reflect on the sacrifices made for us by the armed forces. Many people will be thinking of loved ones who never returned.

“The need to stop Coronavirus from spreading means we can’t gather at war memorials this year. Even so, I believe the sight of people across Maldon District observing the silence on their doorsteps at 11am will paint a picture of respect and thanks for the fallen that is as powerful and moving as any formal parade.”

On Remembrance Day, the Council will be posting a pre-recorded video on social media of wreaths being laid by Cllr Penny Channer and Deputy to the Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Dr James Bettley JP DL at a specially created display at the Council Offices.

The Council will also be posting a message on 11 November, from Garrison Commander, Lieutenant Colonel Jim McManus AAC and a video of the Last Post played by a musician from the British Army Band Colchester edited with WW2 film footage.

The Council is also asking residents not to forget to support the Royal British’s Legion Poppy Appeal. Like so many things this year, the Poppy Appeal has to adapt to the threat of Covid-19 and they are asking the public to support them like never before, because every poppy counts.

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November News from your local district councillor

Five Corners junction – there will be a feasibility study conducted into improving this junction. This will take place by the end of the year, with proposals being put forward for discussion in the new year. It is good that we will get a solution for this very dangerous road junction.

The council is introducing public participation during committee meetings. To do this you will still have to submit a request though the usual way, then if your request is approved, then you will be informed how to attend and speak at a meeting. This is especially important at planning meetings.

Changes for the High Street have been proposed and are being put out to consultation. If you want to have your say on the measures, then please go to the council website. They include a one-way system and restricting the access of all cars to the High Street. I feel this may not be beneficial to the town and is likely to cause issues for the town centre.

The Local Government review to changes to local councils has now been postponed for the foreseeable future.

At the October meeting of the full council, the council approved the sanctions against the previous leader of the council. I was of course pleased that these were agreed. During the meeting and due to the way the votes were cast, it showed that the majority of the Conservatives in the council did not agree to the sanctions.

This has made me take the very difficult decision to leave the Conservative party. I will now sit as an independent Councillor at Maldon District Council. I can reassure you that I will continue to work hard for the Great Totham ward. I will ensure that you are effectively represented and that you have a strong independent voice at the council.

We are writing to let you know we are undertaking repairs to the existing concrete road surface along the A12 between junction 22 and 24.

Works will start on Friday 6 November and are due to last approximately 7 weeks. **Our working times will be each weekend from Friday 8pm until Monday 6am.** However, we will only be working between **Friday 8pm until Sunday 6am** on the weekends of **Friday 13 November** and **Friday 20 November**.

Dependent on weather, additional weeknight closures between 8pm and 6am may be required as a contingency and on-site notices will provide the most up to date information. Due to the nature of the works being carried out, some noise and light disturbance is unavoidable. We will however attempt to keep this to a minimum.

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Churches are as important as key workers in a pandemic

Churches run food banks, provide support for people with mental health problems, offer a welcome to the elderly and the isolated

Across the country, hundreds of churches are hosting internet services for people who don't otherwise have them and volunteers are providing mentoring for people trying to get back into the jobs market, these churches are also busy packing food parcels for people unable to go shopping because they are shielding due to the Covid pandemic, with parishioners and other local residents coming together to help people in their neighbourhoods. It's important work - work that is unpaid and makes a huge difference to society. That it happens at all is down to the buildings that are available to make it happen: churches.

Churches, too, are key places, not just for providing spiritual care but as venues for the voluntary effort so essential to life in this country. This effort is taking place not only in select churches but in tens of thousands of other sacred spaces across Britain.

Today, the National Churches Trust, of which I am a trustee, will publish new research showing that the social value of churches is a staggering £12.4 billion. While £2 billion is direct market value, made up of money used to pay clergy salaries, and on the maintenance of buildings, the rest is an assessment of what would need to be spent to replace what is currently achieved through voluntary effort if it disappeared. And disappear it will if church buildings are not looked after.

One of the curious aspects of life in an increasingly secular Britain is that its churches play as great, if not a more substantial role than ever before in the life of our towns and villages because of all the work that goes on in them. While church worship went online during lockdown, much of the practical help churches provide kept going. So while many people might turn up only at Christmas for a service of worship, they know they can rely on the church 52 weeks of the year to be at the heart of their community.

But the problem is that while the whole community benefits, the responsibility and the cost of maintaining these buildings rests on the shoulders of just a few: the people who form the congregation, whose money in the collection plate - or these days, by standing order - keep the roof repaired and the electrics safe. This is a huge financial burden, and one that those people in the pews struggle to afford. This economic system just isn't viable.

What is needed is a rethink on church grants at central government level so that local services in local buildings can keep responding to local need. And with 900 churches on the English Heritage "at risk" register and many more in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland in a parlous state, this is not just a problem for clerics and churchgoers. It's a national crisis.

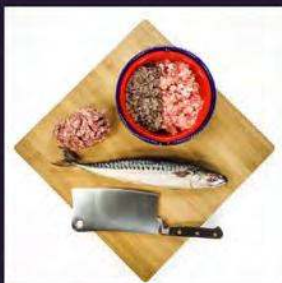
